
## Study

- Survey conducted between 20 June and 3
   August 2016 in partnership with the Canadian
   Polyamory Advocacy Association
- 547 valid responses
  - Women: 320 (30%)
  - Men: 161 (60%)
  - Transgender, genderqueer, genderfluid: 43 (8%)
  - Other: 12 (2%)

### Respondents' participation in polyamorous relationships




n = 534 / 168 (respondents not presently in polyamorous relationship)


### Respondents' province or territory of residence


### Respondents' age


### Age distribution among respondents and Canadian population





### Educational attainment


#### Highest level of education achieved by respondents


#### Education distribution among respondents and Canadian population

#### Respondents' personal and family annual income






### Respondents' ethnic identification


#### Respondent's religious affiliation


#### Number of children in respondents' households


Steps taken by respondents to formalize rights and responsibilities of members of their relationships





# Attitudes about equality


Respondents' agreement with statements about equality among the members of their relationships





### Attitudes about relationship


Respondents' agreement with statements about the rights and responsibilities of members of their relationships





## Attitudes about public perception


Respondents' agreement with statements about the public perception of polyamorous relationships





## Attitudes about public perception


Respondents' agreement with statements about public perception of polyamorous relationships and frequency of polyamory
